Brazil and Japan have over a 100-year history of Japanese immigration to Brazil. Furthermore, the sport of football has grown in Japan with the help of many Brazilian players and coaches, both during the Japan Soccer League years and since the launch of the Japan Professional Football League (J.League) in 1993. As you know, the Japan National Team participated in the 2006 FIFA World Cup under Head Coach Zico. For all of these reasons, I imagine that the Japanese-Brazilian population as well as the football community in Brazil, like me, are looking forward to the successful performance of the Japan National Team.

Nadeshiko Japan, Japan Women's National Team, regrettably will not be participating in this year's Olympic Games. I am sure that the young "Samurais" led by Head Coach Makoto Teguramori have embarked on their matches shouldering the hopes of many people. While there is no such thing as an easy match, Japan will aim for a medal by playing football fairly and leveraging Japan's strengths of teamwork, agility, and creativity, while carrying in its heart the spirit and pride of the "samurai." We will build on this experience for the tournaments such as the 2018 FIFA World Cup, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and the future of Japanese football.

I hope you will join our journey of Japan Olympic National Team.

Creio que essa luta conduzirá ao próxima SAMURAI BLUE (seleção japonesa) e aos Jogos Olímpicos de Tóquio em 2020.

With rigid defense and fast counter-attacks, he pushed Vegalta up to a powerful side. He was then appointed as head coach of U-21 Japan National Team in December 2013.

Com estilo "defesa sólida e contrataque", ele avançou o equipe no segundo lugar na J-League Divisão1 em 2012, e levou-o para Liga dos Campeões da AFC pela primeira vez na história do clube. Em janeiro de 2014 ele foi nomeado como o novo comandante da Seleção Japonesa Sub-21.

Japan won a medal for the first time in history

After participating in Tokyo Olympics 1964, Japan played the game in Mexico four years later. Although Japan could not progress to the final as they lost to Hungary, Japan won against Mexico--the host country in the third place match. Kunishige Kamamoto who scored 7 goals in the competition, became the first Asian top scorer.



Japan worked "Miracle in Miami" against Brazil

Japan played in Olympics for the first time in 28 years, since 1968. They defeated Brazil in the first match, and this victory is known as "Miracle in Miami" for generations. Japan could not go through to the knockout round, however, Atlanta Olympics was a giant step for Japanese football.



Lead by the manager Takashi Sekizuka, Japan won their first match against powerful Spain, and built on the momentum. After go-

ing through to the knockout round for the

first time since 2000 Sydney Olympics, Japan defeated Egypt 3-0 in quarter-finals, and progressed to semi final for the first time in 44 years.
